



Mathematics

- 1 Practise your number bonds to and within 10, 20 and 100 (including quick fire $3 + 4 = 7$, so $30 + 40 = 70$ playing cards or dice are great for practising visual recognition of numbers) and for an extra challenge try $67 + ? = 100$. Use <https://www.random.org> if you don't have cards or dice at home.
- 2 Practise your addition – use Daily ten (top marks website) we use level 2. Try the 2 digit add 2 digit, without renaming and then try the renaming questions. Use your number bonds and sticks and spots to help you.
- 3 Practise your subtraction – use the Top Marks website Daily ten, we use level 2. Try the 2 digit add 2 digit, with out renaming and then try the renaming questions (renaming used to be called carrying). Use your number bonds and sticks and spots to help you.

English (remember to use your neat cursive handwriting) You can use your home learning book to write this in.

- 1 Choose your favourite toy and explain how it works or why it is your favourite. Use your conjunctions (see word mat) to explain why.
- 2 Look at the picture on the Literacy Shed <https://www.literacyshed.com/the-images-shed.html> about the tiny dragon (scroll down the main page). Where is it from? Why is it so small? Are there more like it? Where does it live? Write in your book.
- 3 Look at the picture on literacy shed <https://www.literacyshed.com/the-images-shed.html> about the tiny dragon. How will you look after it? Will you keep it a secret or tell someone? What is it called? Is it magic? What magic can it do?

- 2 Practise reading your year 1 and year 2 words tick off the words you can read. If you can read them all, practise spelling them too.
