<p>1) Science: Go on a bug hunt and identify the creatures you find. We have put some resources from this pack on the website for you to use: https://www.rbkc.gov.uk/PDF/Minbeasts%20pack.pdf Or enter the Great Bug Hunt 2020! http://www.schoolscience.co.uk/bughunt</p> <p>2) Computing: Take photos of local plants & animals you see on a walk and make a presentation about them. You could use Powerpoint, Google slides or Prezi.</p> <p>3) Art: Collect leaves, sticks and other things from your local area and use them to make a nature collage.</p> <p>4) D&T: Bake some biscuits in the shapes of local flowers or animals. Can you guess what they are once they have cooked!</p> <p>5) Music: Look online and learn a poem about wildlife, then add some musical-percussion to jazz it up.</p>	<p>1) Science: If you go on a walk for exercise, take pictures of the plants you see and try to identify them. You could use apps like PlantNet and Tree ID to help you. The Woodland Trust has some fantastic resources to help you learn about the plants and animals you might see if you're lucky enough to be able to go for a walk in woodland near you. http://treetoolsforschools.org.uk/categorymenu/?cat=activities</p> <p>2) Computing: Use an art programme (see below) to draw and then manipulate pictures of plants and animals.</p> <p>3) Art: Make some homemade salt-dough and model a local animal. Paint it if you have paint, watercolours or food-colouring at home...</p> <p>4) D&T: Sew a decoration onto a Tshirt / pillowcase of a local flower or animal.</p> <p>5) Music: Make up a song / rap / rhyme about plants / an animal that lives in your local area.</p>
