


Half term week - Around the world in 80 days Travel in our world and to other fantasy worlds

Week Beginning 25th May 2020



How do we travel around our world? At present, we cannot travel very far but we can use our imaginations to think of travelling to imaginary fantasylands and learn about ways we can travel in our world and the amazing planes, trains and boats of the past and present.

Suggested Activities to choose from for all children. Just for fun!

Find out about Concorde (or another famous plane), The Titanic, The Rocky Mountaineer or the Orient Express.

Find out about Mark Beaumont and his epic journeys around the world. He is an amazing cyclist!

Find out about other people in history who have made extraordinary journeys around the world: Amelia Earhart, Christopher Columbus, Edmund Hillary, Ernest Shackleton, Captain Scott, Ferdinand Magellan, Captain James Cook, Nellie Bly. There are many, many others too!

Design and maybe make a new train. Where would it take you? Under the sea, through the centre of the earth, through mountains, forests or over deserts? It does not have to be real; it could take you to a fantasyland as well!

Draw what you would see from your train window.

Design a new car that is environmentally friendly. Think about its fuel, size, how it would travel (hover cars are super cool!) and how you would drive it.

Go for a walk and see how many of each transport type you can see; cars, bikes, buses, people walking, motorbikes etc.

Make a poster encouraging people to walk or ride a bike to work or school. If you want to send it to Mrs Andrews with your grownups permission - we may use it around school!

Practise making paper airplanes and fly them. Can you make a whole airport for them? Do not forget the passenger terminal! Find out about the world record for the longest paper airplane flight.

Choose a place in the world and think about how you would get there. What forms of transport would you need? How long would it take? What is there to do when you get there?

Design and make a new form of transport that would take you to a fantasy world.

Try to make a papier-mâché hot air balloon, a paper plate hot air balloon or a spinning one!
