Please sign and date the permission slip below if you are happy for your child:

- To take part in school trips and other activities that take place off school premises; and
- To be given first aid or urgent medical treatment during any school trip or activity.

Please note the following important information before signing this form:

- The trips and activities covered by this consent include all visits which take place in the **local area** during the school day (to include, but not limited to visits to Verwood, local schools and Verwood library).
- The trips and activities may involve your child walking or being transported by approved vehicles to the venue or location.
- The school will send you information about each trip or activity before it takes place.

Written parental consent will not be requested from you for the majority of off-site activities offered by the school, for example, year group visits to local amenities, as such activities are part of the school's curriculum and usually take place during the normal school day.

Digital Media



Occasionally, we may take digital images of the children at our school. We may use these images in our school prospectus or in other printed publications that we produce, as well as on our website or on display boards at school.

From time to time, our school may be visited by the media who will take photographs or video of school events. Pupils may appear in these images, which may appear in local or national newspapers, online or on televised news programmes.

To comply with GDPR, we need your permission before we can photograph or make any recordings of your child for the purposes mentioned above.

On occasions your child's class may be recorded whilst taking part in curriculum activities or as a record of school events. These records are sometimes shown during open evenings, assemblies and presentations to inform other children and visitors of activities taking place in school. These recordings are not distributed to a wider audience outside our school Community.

Online Safety



New technologies have become integral to the lives of children in today's society, both within schools and in their lives outside school.

The internet and other communication technologies are powerful tools, which open up new opportunities for everyone. These technologies can stimulate discussion, promote creativity and help secure effective learning.

At Hillside we have some simple rules to help us stay safe online

- I will ask a teacher or suitable adult if I want to use the computers or tablets
- I will only use activities that a teacher or suitable adult has told or allowed me to use
- I will take care of the computer and other equipment
- I will ask for help from a teacher or suitable adult if I am not sure what to do or if I think I have done something wrong
- I will tell a teacher or suitable adult if I see something that upsets me on the screen
- I know that if I break the rules I might not be allowed to use a computer or tablet
